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Foreword

NPT Carers Service is pleased to present this annual report for 2019/2020, marking the 11th year as an independent charitable company. The service continues to grow and develop new and innovative ways of working to provide support to carers with partner organisations.

The Carers Service has carers at the heart of everything it does, it is important to listen and act on what is needed to meet the needs of carers. Whilst we thank our funders for helping us to provide the services for carers, we also recognise the resource pressures on our statutory partners and the difficulties in providing us with the support required. We have also continued to forge a good working relationship with the West Glamorgan Regional Partnership Board to ensure all opportunities are discussed providing the best outcome for our carers locally. There are 2800 carers identified on the NPT Carers Service database, but it is estimated there are at least 7 times more carers in the NPT locality. This highlights that there is much more we need to do to support these hard to reach carers, but that will inevitably require more resources to expand to ensure we can provide that support.

The sitting service is now in its 5th year and there are 16 volunteer sitters. They provide opportunities for carers to take breaks from their caring role to attend health appointments, see other family and friends and to have a life outside their caring commitments. This is held up as an exemplar service and very much required for our carers. Alison Stokes the manager finished during the year moving into a new role and we thank her for her endeavours and commitment to the NPT Carers Service. She was replaced by Mariann Pedersen in December 2019. Early 2020 saw the emergence of the coronavirus pandemic which dramatically changed the delivery of services available to carers with social distancing and staff working remotely.

I would like to thank on behalf of the Board of Trustees, our staff and volunteers for their dedication, resourcefulness and commitment to maintaining such high standards of support for carers. It is exemplary and the reason why NPT Carers Service is held in such high esteem.



Finally, I would like to thank and recognise the many carers in our communities for the compassionate way in which they provide care in its many forms for those they care for. Without that care the statutory services in NPT would not be able to cope or function. You are inspirational and continuously motivate us in the Carers Service to provide the best possible support for you that we can.

38 activities and events were organised to bring carers together for mutual support. Including 12 Coach Trips, 10 MIND Sessions, 4 Cooking Sessions, 14 Singing Sessions and 3 Coffee Mornings.

The West Glamorgan (previously Western Bay) Carers Partnership Board has become a vital partnership, not only to access additional sources of funding but to share good practice. We have been able to learn from developments and improve services across the region.

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of Neath Port Talbot Carers Service Ltd ('the Company') I report to the charity trustees on my examination of the accounts of the Company for the year ended 31 March 2020.
